How does my child get to their blog?

- Go to the Kinkaid Lower School Links page: <u>https://sites.google.com/kinkaid.org/klslinks/home</u>
- Click on the '1st' circle at the top of the screen. Scroll down to First Grade Blogs. Click on your teacher's name.
- Once you're on the Kidblog website, click 'Log In' in the top right corner. Your child will select their name from the drop-down menu. Their password is *Falcon 1*. Click 'Log In'.
- 4. To create a new post, click the blue 'New Post' button in the top right corner. Type a title for your post. Then click in the big box below to type your post. Click 'publish' at the top of the page once you're ready for your post to be read. *Helpful Hint: The post will not publish unless it has a title*.

-The (ng) sound in the medial position = n (ex: sink) -The (ng) sound in the final position = ng (ex: king)

<u>-Week of March 9</u>. The (k) sound in the final position in a onesyllable base word after a short vowel = ck (ex: truck)

<u>-Week of March 24</u>. The (k) sound in final position after a consonant = k (ex: bank)

<u>-Week of March 30</u>. The vowel pair (oo) sound in initial or medial position = oo (ex: book) and the vowel pair (ee) sound in initial or medial position = ee (ex: feet)
